Fiscal servitude and the mirage of recovery

In 2015, the Greek people voted for a left-wing government and furnished it with a clear mandate to abolish the country's fiscal servitude to the neoliberal policies of the EU institutions. Four years later, the country is still held at ransom and continues to mortgage its wealth, while the living standards of the majority of its citizens are continually eroded. A mirage of recovery is presented to the Greek people, while the status quo remains essentially unchanged. The main events and factors that led to the impoverishment of the Greek people, as well as the future prospects for the country are considered.
