



The Collective Organisation of Women and their Voices from the City

With female migrants dominating low paid and ever-expanding domestic work worldwide, *Gaye Yilmaz* and *Sue Ledwith* who brought together the voices of 120 migrating women from 28 different nations and 10 different religious affiliations in their book, will tell us how patriarchal and religious gender codes in the family and at work shape these women's new lives in London, Berlin and Istanbul.

Through their own accounts, they will explore the intersecting multiple and gendered identities women carry from their home countries and how these are reshaped, challenged, changed, or not, as they encounter different structures, traditions and cultural codes in their new countries.

With women's propensity for collective organizing, whether via community, social movements or trade unions as a central theme, Gaye and Sue will also speak on the issues of migration, work and identity with trade union and community organizing.
