

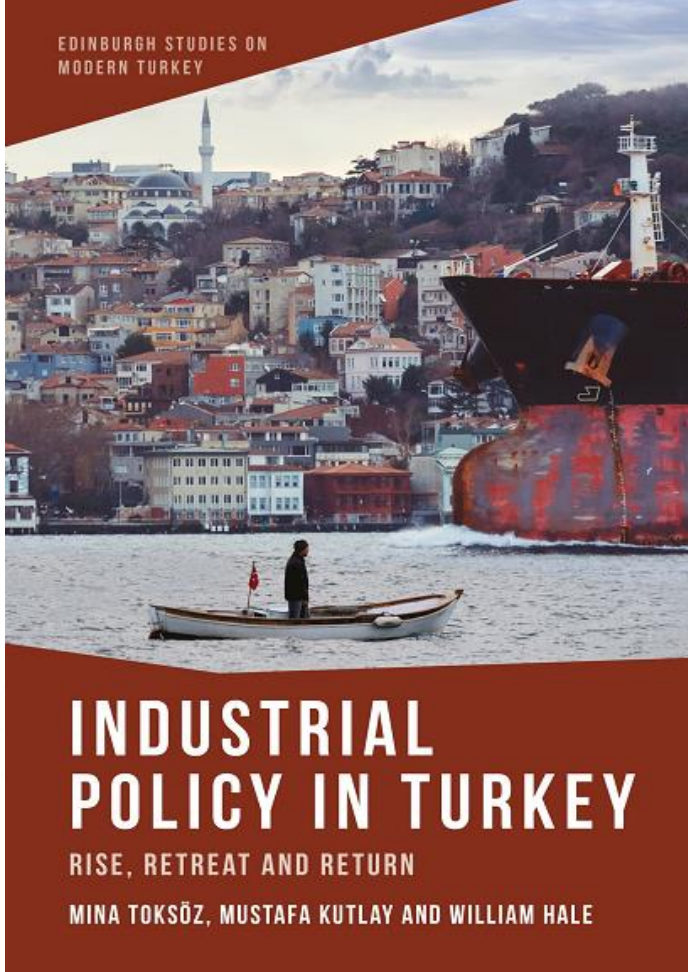

Industrial Policy in Turkey

Rise, Retreat and Return

By Mina Toksoz & William M. Hale



This talk covers the economic development and industrialisation process during the 100 years of the Turkish Republic as guided by industrial policies. It is based on the book by Toksöz, Kutlay and Hale: “Industrial Policy in Turkey” tracing the hey-day of industrial policies in the 1960s, its retreat from the 1980s, and return after the global financial crisis aiming for a high-tech industrial structure. The analysis explores the factors that have hampered the long-term investments needed to extend high-tech production to the wider economy despite generous incentives on offer in the past decade. With many countries pursuing industrial policies today, there is also a warning that while industrial policies are necessary but difficult to implement instruments of development for late industrialisers, its adoption by advanced economies holds many dangers.
